CANADA'S RISING STARS HEADLINE HISTORIC 30TH PELOTON GLENCOE INVITATIONAL

Record \$150,000 purse, 10 returning champions and one of the strongest fields in tournament history set the stage for Canada's next generation of golf stars in Calgary

CALGARY, ALTA., – The Peloton Glencoe Invitational will celebrate a major milestone when the 30th edition of the championship takes place June 18-20, 2026, at The Glencoe Golf & Country Club's renowned Forest Course.

Widely regarded as one of Canada's premier development events, the tournament will feature a 100-player field comprised of elite amateur and professional men and women from across the country, including 10 past champions, current and former Team Canada athletes, rising PGA TOUR Americas and many of Canada's highest-ranked amateur golfers.

The 2026 championship will also feature a record \$150,000 purse, including \$25,000 to the winners of both the men's and women's professional divisions.

"The 30th anniversary of the Glencoe Invitational is an opportunity to celebrate the remarkable players, volunteers, sponsors and partners who have helped build this event into one of the most respected tournaments in Canadian golf," said Dale Goehring, Tournament Chair. "Our mission has always been to create opportunities for players to develop, compete and pursue their dreams. Thirty years later, we're proud to continue providing a stage for Canada's rising stars."

Three Decades of Developing Canadian Golf Talent

Established in 1992 as a men's amateur championship, the Glencoe Invitational has transformed into one of Canada's strongest golf events. The tournament added women's amateur and professional divisions in 2021 and expanded again in 2024 with the introduction of a men's professional division, creating a unique championship that showcases the highest levels of amateur and professional competition for both men and women.

Since its inception, more than 100 former participants have gone on to compete on professional tours around the world, reinforcing the tournament's reputation as one of Canada's premier player-development events.

Notable past champions and participants include PGA TOUR winners Mackenzie Hughes, Nick Taylor, Adam Hadwin, Corey Connors, Taylor Pendrith and Graham DeLaet, along with LPGA and Epson Tour professionals, NCAA Division I athletes and many of Canada's highest-ranked amateur golfers who have advanced to the highest levels of the game.

Final Field Showcases the Depth of Canadian Golf



On the men's side, defending champions Hunter Thomson (Men's Professional) and Brandon Markiw (Men's Amateur) return to headline one of the deepest fields in tournament history. They will be challenged by recent PGA TOUR Americas winner Joey Savoie, multiple Team Canada alumni and rising professionals including Brendan MacDougall, Brady McKinlay, Johnny Travale and Piercen Hunt.

On the women's side, the championship continues its role as part of Golf Canada's She Plays Golf Championship Series. Returning champions Christine Wong (2021, 2023), Sarah-Eve Rhéaume (2022), Victoria Liu (2023) and Josée Doyon (2024) will compete against a strong field of elite amateur and professional talent.

Additionally four participants will make their professional debuts including, Team Canada's Lauren Zaretsky, Gavyn Knight, Michael Weber and Alex Swinnerton, highlighting the tournament's role as a key development pathway for Canada's next generation of professional golfers.

Valuable Exemptions on the Line

Players will compete not only for championship titles and a share of the record purse, but also for valuable exemptions into some of Canada's most prestigious events.

- **Overall Low Male:** PGA Tour America 2026 ATB Classic in Edmonton Sept 17-20, 2026, Final qualifying round for the 2027 RBC Canadian Open
- **Overall Low Female:** 2026 CPKC Women's Open in Edmonton, Alta., August 17-23, 2026
- **Low Male Amateur:** 2026 Canadian Men's Amateur
- **Low Female Amateur:** 2026 Canadian Women's Amateur

With a record purse, one of the strongest fields in tournament history and a growing legacy of developing future stars, the 30th Peloton Glencoe Invitational promises to deliver another memorable chapter in Canadian golf.
